There was no rest in half term for Yeovil College student, Morgan Tidy, 17, formerly of The Gryphon School, as she spent her time in London at the British Film Institute on a residential animation workshop.

The week's worth of study and workshops culminated in a short, animated film that Morgan has created herself and will enter into the BFI's Short Film Festival Competition. The BFI had advertised for talented, driven, passionate young people who were keen to become animation and VFX artists.

Morgan said, *"It was a really great week – fun, but hard work! I'm really enjoying my course and want to get into animation as a career, so it was fantastic experience for me.*

"I'm working on my final project at College at the moment, which is a short film about raising awareness for male victims of domestic abuse, so it was nice to spend a week doing something completely different."

Morgan is studying a Level 2 Extended Certificate in Creative Digital Media Production and hopes to progress on to Level 3 next year, with a view to continuing on to a Foundation Degree at Yeovil College University Centre after that.

The BFI is a registered charity founded in 1933 that awards Lottery funding to various film production, education and market intelligence and research projects, among others.
