

SCIENCE STUDENT AT YEOVIL COLLEGE WINS A SILVER CERTIFICATE IN THE UK CHEMISTRY OLYMPIAD

Erin Lee won a silver certificate in the UK Chemistry Olympiad on the college campus on the 12 of April.

Erin Lee, 19, from South Korea, studies A Level Biology and Chemistry at Yeovil College. She took part in a 2 hour exam of Chemistry questions designed to stretch and challenge the students in the Olympiad competition, competing against other post-16 students across the country.

Erin said, 'I'm really happy that I won the silver award, I've been studying really hard to do well in Chemistry as I am passionate about this subject.'

Erin hopes to study Pharmacy at Nottingham University in the autumn in order to become a Hospital or Community Pharmacist.
