Yeovil College is also part of the South Somerset 14-19 Partnership and North Dorset Partnership. We also work closely with Yeovil District Hospital, Sherborne Learning Centre, Long Sutton Learning Centre, alternative and specialist provision and providers, local employers and community organisations.

Individual and Specialist support

Yeovil College is proud of the care and support it is able to offer students. Staff across the college ensure that all students are supported to succeed on their programme and enjoy their learning experience.

Academic and emotional/social support is provided at all levels for students across the whole college who have been identified as having a specific learning difficulty or disability both in class and on a 1-2-1 basis outside the classroom. This includes support for students

with learning difficulties who require support throughout the day including support with learning, personal care, support at break times and support with accessing transport etc.

The quality of support offered has a high reputation both internally and externally and is often the reason why parents of students with support needs choose the college. Success rates for students receiving support remain high and have increased year on year. There are numerous case studies which can show testament to the way in which support has helped students to succeed and progress to another course, onto university or into employment and examples will be provided. Support is delivered to students across the whole college, including at the University Centre. At all times the aim is to progress students towards the level of independence and confidence required to take the next step in their lives.

The learning that takes place within work placements/internships and throughout the students chosen course is recorded in a variety of ways including mobile phone app, work placement diaries, photographic/video evidence and accredited unit portfolios.

The learning is reviewed regularly and feedback is provided to learners and parents through parent's evenings, progress reports, reviews and/or specialist Person Centred Planning reviews.

What else?

Individual Study Programmes are available for learners with additional needs through an individualised timetable that includes sessions across the college in specific areas of interest or skill. Students have an opportunity to develop their practical and academic skills through detailed programmes of study that are fully supported and bespoke in nature.

Additionally, the college offers a programme of supported internships in partnership with Yeovil District Hospital where students are placed in such departments as medical records, equipment library, equipment sterilisation, the Hospital Academy, cafeteria and pharmacy as part of Project Search.

Students with additional needs enjoy our new and purpose-built independent living centre. Students develop and practice skills associated with independent living such as cooking, cleaning and maintaining a home. The Independent Living Skills Centre programmes are designed to suit the individual student's needs according to whether they will progress onto fully supported living, supported housing and/or independent life.

Students on full time programmes, who have not gained a GCSE at A – C grade can study accredited functional skills English and maths qualifications or GCSE according to assessed need/ability.

At Yeovil College, we encourage students to take part in a wide range of enrichment activities, such as sport, societies and volunteering.

Yeovil College is keen to develop skills in preparation for work and have a focus on employability skills in all programmes of study and are dedicated to providing opportunities for work experience either in College itself and/or in our local employment community.
